- **Better Regulation Executive (CoMAH)**

Be aware:

- Don't put yourself in the line of fire
- Make sure drivers of large vehicles see you
- Maintain awareness of your surroundings

### Valve Orientation

- Consider the implications of unusually orientated or positioned valve actuators – a Human Factors review may highlight possible improvements and reduce the risk in unplanned loss of containment.
